What You Must Bring To Get Your Taxes Done

- Your Social Security Card (also, if filing jointly, spouse's Social Security Card)**
- Social Security Cards for all Claimed Dependents**
- Valid Picture ID (e.g., Michigan Driver's License/State ID, Veteran's Administration ID, etc.)**
- Proof of Income**
 - o Wages / Salary - - Including Tips (all Forms W-2)
 - o Scholarships (Form 1098-T)
 - o Interest and Dividends (Form 1099-INT and/or 1099-DIV)
 - o State Income Tax Refunds
 - o Self Employment Income (e.g., Earnings from Contract Labor, Small Business, Hobby, etc.)
 - o Alimony Income
 - o Proceeds (or loss) from Sale of Stocks, Bonds, or Real Estate (including your home)
 - o Disability Income (Dept. of Veterans Affairs Statement, Form 1099-SSI)
 - o Pensions and / or IRA Distributions (Form 1099-R)
 - o Unemployment Compensation (Form 1099-G)
 - o Social Security Benefits (Form 1099-SSA)
 - o Income from Rental Property
 - o Miscellaneous Income: Gambling / Lottery Winnings (Form 1099-G); Awards, Jury Duty, etc.
- Proof of Expenses**
 - o If Itemizing Deductions – Medical Expenses, Charitable Contributions
 - o Alimony (bring recipient's SSN)
 - o Contributions to an IRA, 401K (post tax), or Other Retirement Account
 - o Educational Expenses (e.g., College Tuition, Computers, Books, Student Loan Interest, etc.)
 - o Child / Dependent Care Expenses - Amount paid for day care with the day care provider's tax identification number (or an individual's Social Security #)
 - o Total amount of Heating Costs paid in 2009 / DTE bills
- Homeowners**
 - o Proof of taxable value of your home and amount of summer/ winter property taxes billed
 - o If Itemizing Deductions - Mortgage Interest (Form 1098)
 - o Energy Efficiency Home Improvements (Receipts for new windows, insulation, furnace, etc.)
 - o New Home Buyers (New Home Purchase Agreement; If Available, Closing Statement)
 - o Home Foreclosure (Form 1099-C)
- Renters**
 - o Lease or rental contract for the tax year; Landlord's name, address & zip codes
- Other Information**
 - o Copy of last years federal and state tax returns
 - o For direct deposit, bank or credit union name, account number and routing number
